A Message FROM OUR CEO

Welcome to our 42nd Edition of the newsletter.

January and February have been very challenging months for many people. COVID cases have had a very large impact on our community for the first time during the pandemic. We have felt it at CLRS with 54 cases having been experienced by clients and staff in these 2 months alone. This is why we are committed to supporting our clients and staff to have their 3rd dose vaccinations. All of our staff are on track to meet the mandatory vaccination requirements brought in by the Victorian Government, which reflects our dedication to making sure we keep our clients and community safe.

In the last newsletter, I spoke about our new Strategic Plan. As part of this plan, we have refreshed our vision and values. Our vision is now 'to empower individuals and families to live the life they choose in a community enriched by the inclusion of all'. OPENING DOORS PROJECT

Barry St Update

The development at Barry Street in Echuca, is moving along at an incredible pace. The four units now have their bricks and their roofs nearly complete. CERNO, the project managers, and Bourke Builders have been working extremely hard to ensure that there have been no supply issues and the timelines of the project are maintained. The project began in October 2021 and is expected to be completed in mid April 2022.

The clients who are moving into these units have been completing site visits, when COVID has allowed, to keep an eye on the progress of their units. These individuals are looking forward to moving in, in the near future. With the build scheduled to be completed in mid April, we will soon be working out if we can hold an official opening. We are really hopeful that this can happen this year but we will also be creating a virtual tour, just in case!



School Holiday Program

The January Club Teen Vacation program brought smiles to many faces when the young people enjoyed an array of fun activities. The group visited Aquamoves swimming pool in Shepparton, particularly enjoying the waterslide, Picnic Point where they fished and participated in bush activities, cooking, dancing and a trip to Bendigo to Gurri Wanyarra - Kangaroo Flat Swimming centre.

The Club Teen program aims to upskill participants to develop age appropriate independent daily living skills; build and maintain friendships and support to access the community to keep themselves safe.

In late January, the staff and clients worked together to cook a BBQ lunch, make lamingtons and decorate a delicious-looking pavlova. This was an opportunity for the young people to practice hand hygiene, putting on gloves, cutting food, preparing food and practicing social skills.

A huge shout out to all our young people who attend our Club Teen programs and the wonderful Club Teen staff who support our young people in having fun and learning new skills.

The After School program runs Monday to Friday from 3pm – 6pm. Transport is available from local schools to Club Teen.

The Vacation program runs Monday to Friday from 8am – 6pm in school holidays. (Not on Public Holidays)
