NDIS Audit Results

We successfully completed our NDIS re certification assessment in May with the assessors recommending to the NDIS that we maintain our NDIS registration.

We were assessed against more than 100 quality indicators to ensure that we meet the NDIS Practice Standards. The assessors looked at our systems, policies and procedures, spoke with clients, staff and reviewed files as part of the process.

The assessors passed on feedback from our clients including:

The assessors said that CLRS strengths included - Staff that genuinely care, commitment to improving, the standard of our facilities and high levels of interaction with our clients. Next, we will complete work to improve 6 minor issues identified in the assessment and afterwards the report will go to the commission for processing.
