We had a fantastic time being on-site at the 2024 Riverboats Music Festival in February and are proud to be their community partner. Our marquee was manned with 27 volunteers across the 3 days selling over 1,000 raffle tickets and preloved items; hats, blankets and sunglasses that had been sourced by our Recyclability team. Our volunteers wore bright blue t-shirts with a QR code printed on them so that people could scan and buy their tickets online. Thank you to Worklocker Echuca who donated the printing on the t-shirts and Echuca Moama Signs for donating the signage for our 2 A-Frames and corflute signs used at our marquee over the weekend. Thank you to everyone who purchased a ticket, you helped us raise \$5,170 from the raffle.

Our 16th Annual Fundraising Dinner was held on 29 February. Janine Shepherd was a fantastic speaker that had the audience mesmerised and inspired by her resilience. Our 250 guests had a wonderful evening donating and bidding, helping us to raise \$79,932. Thank you to everyone who bought a Riverboats Music Festival raffle ticket. You helped us raise \$5,170 for our Opening Doors Project - building homes for people with disability. The amount raised by the sale of blankets, hats, sunglasses and coffee cups was \$540, which goes directly back into our recyclability program. Festival goers also very generously donated a total of \$1,508 on top of our raffle ticket sales, bringing the total raised for 2024 to \$7,200.
