Celebrating Faye Barry

For six years, Faye Barry has been an important part of our Murray River Tea Rooms (MRTR) social enterprise. Faye's incredible dedication and generosity have left a lasting impression on clients, families, staff and our community. Faye has been making and donating her famous tomato relish, a beloved staple at the Murray River Tea Rooms for over 6 years.

Her husband, Ian, recalls their efficient system with Glenn, a CLRS staff member at the MRTR. "Whenever the relish was getting low, Glenn would ring for more.



Looking back at the records, winter was the best-selling time, as some months it was only 15 days, and the relish would be sold out. During summer, it would take a month until it would sell out. It was so good to be able to help," Ian shared.

Over the past six years, Faye has made an astounding 2,527 jars of relish. This remarkable achievement highlights not only her culinary skills but also her commitment to supporting CLRS. Faye's relish was a hit, sold in jars to the public and used in the Murray River Tea Rooms popular toasted ham and cheese sandwiches.

Faye began working as a Direct Support Professional in 2008 at the age of 67 and completed a traineeship in 2009. Faye enjoyed supporting people with disability and her passion for helping others was evident in every jar of relish she made.

In September 2024, at the age of 82, Faye hung up her relish-making apron. Her contributions have been invaluable, and her legacy will continue to inspire us. Thank you, Faye, for your incredible dedication and for making our community a better place. Your generosity and hard work have had such a positive impact, and we are forever grateful.
