His story of losing his legs while on duty in Afghanistan in 2012, representing Australia in the Paralympics just 4 years later in 2016 and all that he has achieved is truly incredible. I am thrilled to share that we raised \$83,197 on the night, thanks to the generous support of our community. The total raised through the fundraising dinners has now exceeded \$1,000,000 which is an amazing achievement. The work of all the fundraising committees over the years, who delivered these 17 events, has made this possible, as has the incredible support for our dinner.

The generous support of our business community in donating items, vouchers and professional services enables us to raise these funds and CLRS is grateful for every bit of support we receive.

At the dinner we released a video, called <u>Out of Home Care - Safeguarding the Future</u>, which shares the story of the 24/7 residential care services we provide to children and young people. Riverboats Music Festival 2025

Riverboats Music Festival 2025 was an absolute blast! We are thrilled to say that we sold out of raffle tickets across the 3 day weekend, thanks to the support of the amazing crowd.

They also shopped up big at our marquee that was onsite for the weekend, which was filled with generous donations from our Recyclability program.

In total, we raised \$7,100. We made \$5,700 from raffle tickets, this money goes directly to our Opening Doors Project - building homes for people with disability. We made \$1,400 from Recyclability on-site marquee sales that go directly back into our Recyclability program.

A huge shoutout to our dedicated volunteers who sold a staggering 1,200 raffle tickets in just 3 days.
